
Published in December 2023, reports like this are authored by a committee of experts and include findings, conclusions, and recommendations based on the extant literature gathered by the committee.


## The evidence

COMMITTEE AND STAFF CONDUCTED THREE LITERATURE SEARCHES BETWEEN JANUARY AND JUNE 2023, ADJUSTING SEARCH TERMS EACH TIME WITH INPUT FROM THE COMMITTEE.

THE TERMS AIMED TO FIND LITERATURE REVIEWS, SYSTEMATIC REVIEWS, AND META-ANALYSES WITH A FOCUS ON THE HEALTH EFFECTS OF SOCIAL MEDIA EXPOSURE ON ADOLESCENT HEALTH THAT HAD BEEN PUBLISHED SINCE 2018.


